Article 1

The General Education Interdisciplinary Microprogram is centered around key thematic issues, creating an interdisciplinary learning environment that integrates general education disciplines and departmental courses. This program combines social responsibility, practical application, and autonomous learning and is divided into three major domains: "Foundational Interdisciplinary," "Thematic Issues," and "Practical Orientation." It aims to inspire students' interdisciplinary thinking, deeply connect knowledge, emphasize practical application, and nurture STEAM talents, laying the foundation for holistic education.

Article 2: Eligibility

All current undergraduate students of Tamkang University who have an interest in the relevant fields are eligible to apply for this program.

Article 3: Application Process

Students must complete the "Tamkang University General Education Interdisciplinary Micro-Program Application Form" and submit it to the General Education and Core Curriculum Center office between the start of each semester and the course add/drop deadline.

Article 4: Program Certification

- 1. Upon completing at least one course in each of the three domains—"Foundational Interdisciplinary," "Thematic Issues," and "Practical Orientation"—with a minimum total of four courses, and passing all required courses, students may apply for certification by submitting the "Tamkang University General Education Interdisciplinary Micro-Program Credit Certificate Application Form" along with the original transcript to the General Education and Core Curriculum Center office.
- 2. Upon approval of the certification review, the university will issue the "Tamkang University General Education Interdisciplinary Microprogram Certificate."

3. Courses taken before applying for this microprogram that are designated as part of the micro-program may be counted towards the required credits upon review.

Article 5

Students may not use the completion of this microprogram as a reason to extend their graduation date.

Article 6

Each microprogram within the themes should include six to eight courses. Any adjustments to course titles or credit hours will be based on the course list published by the General Education and Core Curriculum Center

Article 7

Matters not covered by these guidelines shall be handled in accordance with the relevant regulations of Tamkang University.

Article 8

These guidelines shall be implemented following approval by the General Education Committee and ratification by the University President. The same procedure applies to any amendments.
